Overview

Kumaraguru Action for Relief and Empowerment (KARE) was formulated in the month of November 2015 to support and aid the flood affected people. The initiative started in Kumaraguru College of Technology, Coimbatore, but later, people from all over India started contributing for this cause. Its main objectives are to support the people who are affected by natural calamities, to make itself available for the needy, and to emerge as a voluntary movement. The primary strategy or focus of implementation is as follows:

- Rescue
- Relief
- Rebuild
- Research

KARE was involved in relief and rehabilitation works in flood hit areas in Kerala during 2018 in various places like Palakkad, Wayanad, Ernakulam and Idukki. These included various camps in Munnar, Anachal, Pallivaasal and Maryland

Kerala Floods

Period : 10.08.2018 to 27.08.2018

KCT-KARE and volunteers from different parts of India were able to cover villages in 8 districts and reach out 4000 families, and distributed material worth of Rs.10,00,000/-. The Sakthi Group of companies actively participated and supported the initiative.

Relief activities were carried out in the following places:

- Palakkad,
- Wayanad
- Ernakulam
- Idukki
- Camp sites in Munnar, Anachal, Pallivaasal and Maryland.

Cyclone - GAJA

Period : 01.11.2018 to 31.12.2018

KARE was actively involved in relief and rehabilitation works in the Cyclone-GAJA hit delta regions of Tamil Nadu during November-December 2018. The team was also involved in rehabilitation of schools in the village of Mannargudi. **KCT-KARE and volunteers from different parts of India** were able to cover **villages in 6 districts** and reach out **2500 households**, and distributed material worth of Rs.10,00,000/-. The Sakthi Group of companies and other well-wishers actively participated and supported the initiative.

KARE- KCT volunteers involved in painting of classrooms, compound walls, distribution of books and sports materials to school students and cleaned the entire premises of both the schools.



Bandipur Forest Fire

Period : 01.02.2019 to 31.03.2019

An amount of Rs.50,000/- was contributed towards funds for Bandipur Forest fire tragedy by KARE during February 2019. The funds will be used for emergency requirements and for recovery. During March 2019, KARE sponsored and

handed over essential relief materials like mineral water cans, sugar, aval and groundnut candy to Tamil Nadu Forest Department, Mudumalai.

Cyclone Fani - Odisha

Period : 01.05.2019 to 31.05.2019



KCT-KARE funded and distributed relief materials with the support of local NGOs & Sakthi Sugars for the Odisha Fani cyclone-affected people in Brahmagiri in Puri district. The following materials were distributed:

- Rice – 15 Quintals
- Dal – 2 Quintals
- Napkins – 100 packets

Kerala and Tamil Nadu Floods

Period : 01.08.2019 to 31.08.2019



During August 2019, KARE was involved in relief works in rain hit areas of **Attapadi, Palakad District, Kerala; Sarkarpathy settlement in Sethumadai village, Tamil Nadu; and Wayanad, Kerala**. Relief materials worth Rs.1,85,000/- were distributed to 80 households.

Tamil Nadu Rain

Period : 01.09.2019 to 30.05.2019



During September 2019, KARE team with its student volunteers & staff members distributed relief materials worth Rs.82,000/- to 60 households in villages in **Gudalur, Tamil Nadu**, which were affected by heavy rains and flood. The team reached out to Thorapalli, Kadalakolli regions in Gudalur.

ITS Raining Raincoats

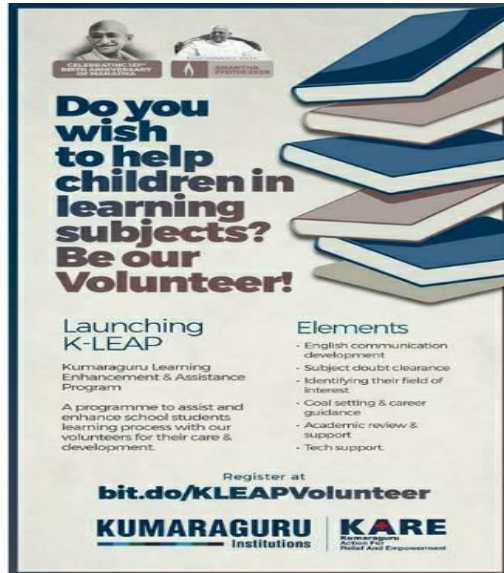
Period – July 2020

initiated in July 2020, school education for few girl children have been arranged through sponsors and local support.

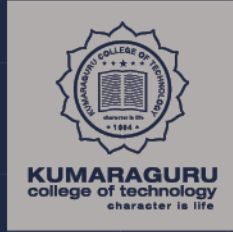
KLEAP
